

Past and Present Railroads of Fairfield County, Ohio

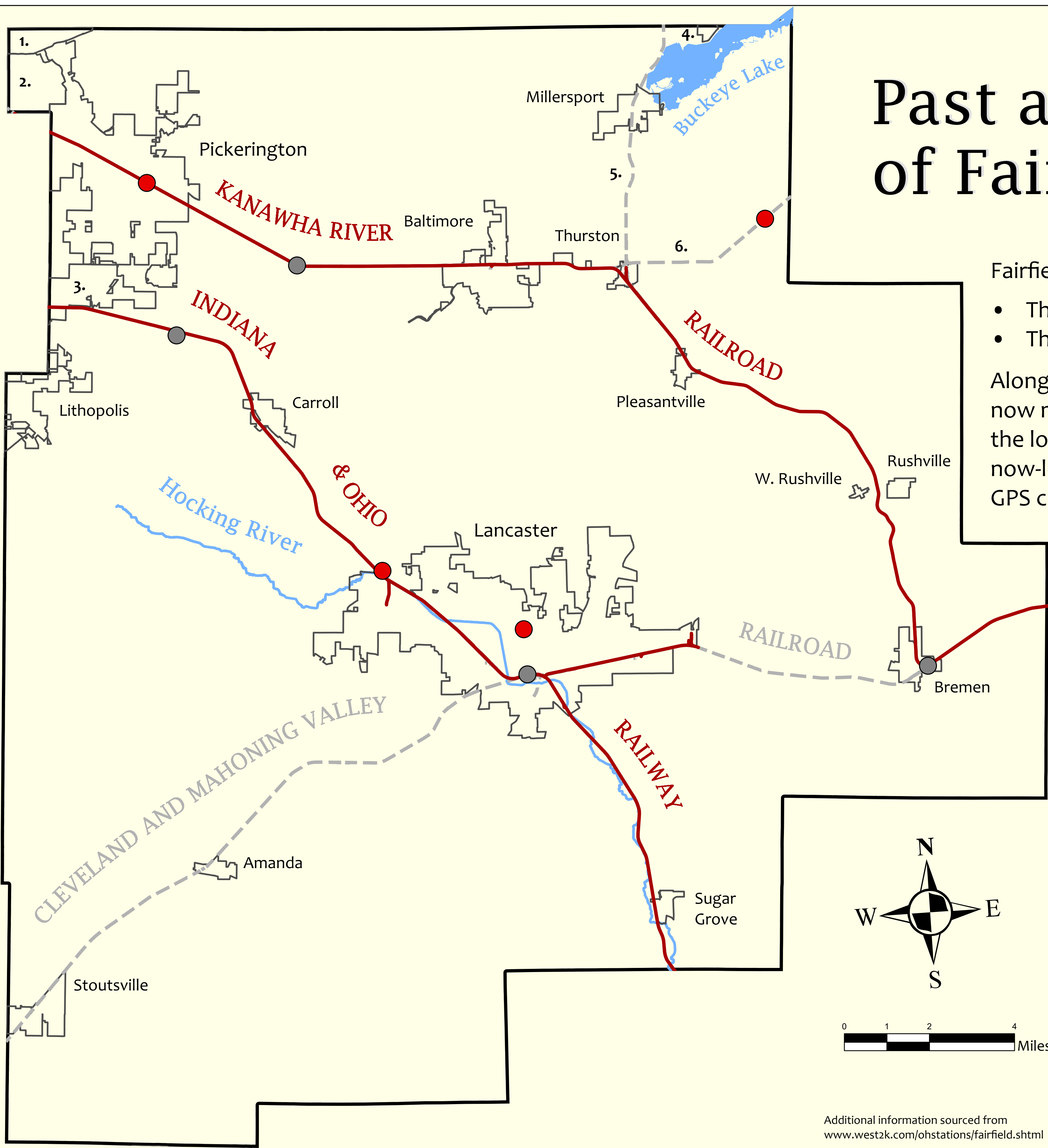
Fairfield County has two major railroads cutting right through it—

- The Indiana & Ohio Railway
- The Kanawha River Railroad

Along these past and present tracks still exist some former passenger stations, now mixed-use private property, indicated by the red dots. The gray dots show the location of some of the stations now lost to time. There were plenty of these now-lost stations, but the ones included on this map are the few that had specific GPS coordinates. All others were omitted solely in order to avoid inaccuracies.

There are approximately 27 miles of Indiana & Ohio Railway track in the county, 468 miles in the state, as well as 20 and 23 miles in Indiana and Michigan respectively. The railroad runs across the western and central parts of Ohio, from Logan and Cincinnati, up to Delta, OH and to Dundee, MI.

There are approximately 30 miles of Kanawha River Railroad track in the county, about 120 miles in the state, as well as 140 miles in West Virginia. The railroad goes through Ohio from Columbus, crosses the Ohio River at Point Pleasant, WV, then follows its namesake river to Charleston, connecting the two states' capitals. The railroad keeps going, trekking into central West Virginia to the villages of Cornelia and Ravencliff.
